Keynote Speaker – Dr. James Malec

Dr. Malec is Research Director for the Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana Foundation and Professor Emeritus, Mayo Clinic. He is Board Certified in Clinical Neuropsychology and in Rehabilitation Psychology through the American Board of Professional Psychology. He is active in both lay and professional groups involved with the concerns of people with brain injuries, including the Brain Injury Association, the American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine, and the International Neuropsychological Society. He has received a number of professional recognitions, including the Lowman Award from the American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine for interdisciplinary contributions to rehabilitation, and the Career Service Award from the Brain Injury Association of Minnesota. He has over 100 peer-reviewed publications as well as other professional publications and continues to conduct research in brain injury rehabilitation and other areas of neuropsychology and behavioral medicine.

Traci Foster

Traci Foster is actor, artist and educator who was Canada's first certified teacher of Fitzmaurice Voicework™. She explores and develops her work through a blend of Fitzmaurice Voicework™, extended vocal technique, movement, mask, acting, and singing. She has worked and studied in her internationally for the past 15 years.

Her latest area of creative focus is as the Artist in Residence at SSILC – South Saskatchewan Independent Living Center – where she conducts workshops and works privately with disabled and non-disabled emerging artists. She has recently been awarded a second Creative Partnership Innovations Grant from the Saskatchewan Arts Board, to continue the work with people living with disability. Traci is currently planning a creative development through mask and voice workshop for emerging and professional artists with disabilities.

This lecture, demonstration and discussion session will look at achieving optimal outcomes by exploring creative ways to work with people living with acquired brain injuries as well as tools to promote professional development and self care for the professionals working in this area. The session will follow the slogan – art for the health of it!
